



Candle Burning Tips

Lighted candles should always be within site. Never leave a burning candle unattended.

Before lighting candles, be sure to remove all packaging that may come into contact with the candle flame.

Burn candles on a stable, heat-resistant, dry, surface, away from any combustible materials. Use non-flammable holders designed for the particular size and shape of the candle.

Always burn candles out of the reach of children and pets.

Keep burning candles away from drafts, vents, and air currents.

Trim wick(s) to 1/4" before burning.

If smoking, flickering, or high flame height occurs, extinguish candle. Cool, trim wick(s), check for drafts, and relight.

Always keep the candle's pool of wax free from trimmings, matches, and debris in order to prevent flaring or container damage.

For best performance, burn candles no longer than 4 hours and avoid drafts.

Always burn candles in a well-ventilated room.

Avoid using filled glass containers that are chipped, cracked or otherwise damaged.

Never extinguish candles with water. Doing so may cause wax to spatter or glass containers to break.

Never move a burning candle. Glass containers and liquid wax can get very hot. Extinguish flame and allow wax to harden before moving.

Discontinue burning candles when 2" of wax remains (1/2" for container candles).

Lighted candles should be placed at least 3" apart from one another.

Candle Storage and Use

Store candles in a cool, dark place.

Votives and pillars can easily be cleaned with a piece of nylon or a damp, soft cloth.

Never use a knife or sharp instrument to remove wax from a holder; this may scratch, weaken, or cause glass to break.
